Moses and the burning bush.

Memory Words

Exodus 4:1–17

Moses receives signs and power.

Memory Words

EXODUS 4:12

"Now go; I will help you speak and will teach you what to say."

Lesson 3 of 4: Following God

Exodus 5:1–21

Moses and Aaron visit Pharaoh.

Memory Words

EXODUS 5:2

Pharaoh said, "Who is the LORD, that I should obey him and let Israel go? I do not know the LORD and I will not let Israel go."

Lesson 4 of 4: Believing God

Exodus 7:14–24

Moses and the plague of blood.

Memory Words

EXODUS 7:17

"By this you will know that I am the LORD: With the staff that is in my hand I will strike the water of the Nile, and it will be changed into blood."

UNIT 2 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

Deuteronomy 6:6–7

These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts ... Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.

Lesson 1 of 4: Obeying God

Exodus 8:20–32

Moses and the plague of flies.

Memory Words

EXODUS 8:27

“We must take a three-day journey into the desert to offer sacrifices to the LORD our God, as he commands us.”

Lesson 2 of 4: Fearing God

Exodus 12:21–30

Moses and the final plague, which is remembered on Passover.

Memory Words

EXODUS 12:14

“This is a day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD—a lasting ordinance.”

Lesson 3 of 4: Trusting God

Exodus 14:5–31

Moses and his people cross the Red Sea.

Memory Words

EXODUS 14:13

“Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the LORD will bring you today.”

Lesson 4 of 4: Loving God

Exodus 20:5–31

Moses gives the Ten Commandments.

Memory Words

EXODUS 20:2–3

“I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me.”

UNIT 3 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

Joshua 1:9

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

Lesson 1 of 4: The Pioneer

Joshua 1; 6

God calls Joshua, who wins the battle of Jericho.

Memory Words

JOSHUA 1:6

"Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their forefathers to give them."

Lesson 2 of 4: The Prophet

2 Kings 4:1–37

Elisha increases the widow's oil and raises the Shunammite woman's son.

Memory Words

2 KINGS 4:13

Elisha said to him, "Tell her, 'You have gone to all this trouble for us. Now what can be done for you?'"

Lesson 3 of 4: The Priority

2 Kings 22–23

Josiah restores obedience to the Book of the Law.

Memory Words

2 KINGS 23:3

The king stood by the pillar and renewed the covenant in the presence of the LORD—to follow the LORD and keep his commands.

Lesson 4 of 4: The Promise (Thanksgiving)

Isaiah 53:1–7

Isaiah prophesies about a future suffering servant (Jesus).

Memory Words

ISAIAH 53:7

He was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

UNIT 4 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

Isaiah 40:31

But those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

Lesson 1 of 4: The Right Choice

1 Kings 17:1–7

Elijah receives God's care.

Memory Words

1 KINGS 17:2,4

Then the word of the LORD came to Elijah: "... You will drink from the brook, and I have ordered the ravens to feed you there."

Lesson 2 of 4: The Fallen Child

1 Kings 17:8–24

Elijah raises the widow's son to life.

Memory Words

1 KINGS 17:22

The LORD heard Elijah's cry, and the boy's life returned to him, and he lived.

Lesson 3 of 4: The Proclamation

1 Kings 18:16–39

Elijah defeats the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel.

Memory Words

1 KINGS 18:37

"Answer me, O LORD, answer me, so these people will know that you, O LORD, are God, and that you are turning their hearts back again."

Lesson 4 of 4: The Prince (Christmas)

Isaiah 9:6

A son is to be given (birth of Christ foretold).

Memory Words

ISAIAH 9:6

And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

UNIT 5 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

Joshua 1:8

“Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.”

Lesson 1 of 4: Seeking God

Romans 15:4; 2 Peter 1:20–21

The origin of the Bible.

Memory Words

ROMANS 15:4

For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.

Lesson 2 of 4: Finding God

John 8:31–32; 1 Peter 2:2–3

The purpose of the Bible.

Memory Words

JOHN 8:31–32

“If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.”

Lesson 3 of 4: Knowing God

Psalms 5:1–3; John 15:5–8

The value of the Bible.

Memory Words

PSALM 5:3

In the morning, O LORD, you hear my voice; in the morning I lay my requests before you and wait in expectation.

Lesson 4 of 4: Honoring God

Isaiah 55:10–11; Psalm 19:7–8

The handiwork of the Bible.

Memory Words

PSALM 19:8

The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes.

UNIT 6 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

2 Corinthians 5:20–21

We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Lesson 1 of 4: His Call

Luke 5:1–11

Jesus calls His disciples.

Memory Words

LUKE 5:10

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men."

Lesson 2 of 4: His Caution

Luke 14:7–11

Jesus tells a parable about a wedding feast.

Memory Words

LUKE 14:11

"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Lesson 3 of 4: His Command

John 3:1–7

Jesus guides Nicodemus to be born again.

Memory Words

JOHN 3:5

Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit."

Lesson 4 of 4: His Cure

John 4:46–54

Jesus heals the official's son.

Memory Words

JOHN 4:53

Then the father realized that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he and all his household believed.

UNIT 7 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

Isaiah 53:5

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed.

Lesson 1 of 4: His Ride

Mark 11:1–11

Jesus rides into Jerusalem.

Memory Words

MARK 11:9

Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Lesson 2 of 4: His Reminder

Mark 14:12–26

Jesus and the Last Supper.

Memory Words

MARK 14:22

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take it; this is my body."

Lesson 3 of 4: His Redemption

Matthew 27:32–54

Jesus is crucified.

Memory Words

MATTHEW 27:54

When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified, and exclaimed, "Surely he was the Son of God!"

Lesson 4 of 4: His Rise (Easter)

Matthew 28:1–10

Jesus is raised by God from the dead.

Memory Words

MATTHEW 28:5–6

The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said."

UNIT 8 of 8

Unit Bible Passage

Galatians 5:22–23

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Lesson 1 of 4: Fruit of the Spirit (summary)

Galatians 5:22–23

The Fruit of the Spirit.

Memory Words

GALATIANS 5:22–23

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Lesson 2 of 4: Fruit from God (part 1)

1 Corinthians 13:1–13

Love, joy and peace (the greatest of these is love).

Memory Words

1 CORINTHIANS 13:13

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

Lesson 3 of 4: Fruit for Others (part 2)

Ephesians 4:25–32

Patience, kindness, goodness (building others up).

Memory Words

EPHESIANS 4:32

Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

Lesson 4 of 4: Fruit to Live By (part 3)

2 Timothy 2:22–26

Faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (call on the Lord out of a pure heart).

Memory Words

2 TIMOTHY 2:22

Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
