

Genesis 3 Adam and Eve sin against God. Adam and Eve lived in a garden that God created for them.

One day a bad serpent asked Eve if God really said they could not eat from any tree in the garden. Eve told him they could eat from any tree but the one in the middle, which was the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. God said that if they ate from that tree, they would die. The serpent said that they would not die, but rather be like God, knowing good and evil. Eve believed the serpent and ate the fruit so she could be like God. Then she gave some to Adam and he ate it too.

Afterward, they felt ashamed for disobeying God. They covered their bodies with leaves and hid from God when they heard Him walking in the garden. God called out to Adam and Eve, "Where are you?" Adam said he was afraid because he was naked and so he hid. God asked if they had eaten from the forbidden tree. Adam said Eve gave him some fruit and he ate it. Eve said the serpent tricked her and she ate it. God turned to the serpent and cursed it so it would crawl on its belly and eat dirt. God told Adam that feeding his family outside of the garden would be painful work. Also, Adam would not live forever, but return to dust. Then God sent Adam and Eve out of the garden.

LESSON SETTING: God tells Adam and Eve to eat of any plant they wish but one. That tree's fruit brings death. But a serpent tells Eve that God lied. He claims the fruit brings wisdom, not death. So Adam and Eve eat. Consequently, God says they will indeed die. But one day Eve's descendant will crush the serpent (Genesis 3:15). Graciously, God makes Eve able to create life through painful childbirth and Adam able to sustain life through painful toil.








Genesis 6 God commands Noah to build an ark.



God plans to wash the earth of corruption. As part of that plan, He calls the righteous man Noah to build an ark to hold his family, animals, and food.







LESSON SETTING: After Noah, his family, and the animals enter the ark, rain comes. It rains for 40 days and 40 nights. The floodwaters wash corruption from the earth. Therefore, God's promise to Eve of a descendant who will defeat the serpent will come through Noah. Additionally, God shortens human lives, thereby limiting the amount of evil any one person can do to another, and limiting the amount of suffering any one person must endure (Genesis 6:3).





Genesis 8 God makes a promise to His creation.



God caused a wind to blow over the earth and the waters to go down. The ark landed on the top of a mountain called Mount Ararat! There was still too much water everywhere to come out of the ark, so Noah decided to see if there was dry land nearby. Noah thought if he sent a bird out to fly around, it might be able to land on dry ground. Noah had made a window in the ark. He let a raven out, but it flew around and had nowhere to land. Later, Noah sent out a dove, but it too had nowhere to put its feet, so it came back. After seven days, Noah sent the dove out again, but this time the dove came back with an olive leaf in its beak.

Noah waited seven more days and sent the dove out again. This time the dove did not come back. There was dry ground nearby! Noah removed the ark's cover. God told Noah to come out and to bring his family and all the animals out, too! He said He wanted Noah's family and all the animals to have lots of babies to fill up the earth! Noah built an altar to God to remember that God had brought them safely from the flood. God promised that He would never again destroy all living creatures upon the earth by a flood.






